

WHO IS JESUS?

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PROLOGUE

In this booklet I invite you to discover who Jesus really is and to run into His arms to receive His love, His salvation and His nurturing leadership in your life. His judgment rests entirely on who chooses Him; who enters fully into His loving embrace or who turns their back on His outstretched arms.

Let's take a poll and see who really knows who Jesus is.

"Excuse me sir, you look like a businessman off to an important meeting. May I ask you one simple question as part of a public survey?"

"That answer was correct. Jesus is the Son of God, but it did not tell us who Jesus is to you. It only told us who Jesus is to God. Let's ask this young man leaning against the building. Sir, would you mind answering one simple question for our public survey?"

Teenager: "Sure, dude, but I haven't got all day, you know."

"I'll be brief. Can you tell me who Jesus is to you?"

Young man: "That's a weird question, but I guess I'd have to say He was a great teacher, kind of like Buddha and Gandhi and those guys."

"Thank you. That answer is also correct because Jesus was and is a great teacher, but it didn't tell us who Jesus is to you. It only told us what Jesus did and does. Let's ask this little girl. Young lady, would you please answer a question for a public survey?"

Little girl: "Sure. What do you want to know?"

"Who is Jesus to you?"

Little girl: "I don't know anybody named Jesus. Does he have a last name?"

“Sometimes people use His title as a last name. Jesus Christ.”

Little girl: “Oh yeah! I’ve heard of Him. My Daddy says His name a lot when he’s watching the news on TV or when he watches football. Whoever He is, I don’t think many people like Him.”

“You are absolutely right. People either love Him or they hate Him. You were very honest, thank you. You don’t know Jesus at all. I’ll ask this young man walking so briskly by. ”Sir! Sir! May I ask one quick question for our public survey?”

Young man: “Exactly one quick question is all I’ll answer.”

“Who is Jesus to you?”

Young man: “Why, He’s my Savior. He’s the Savior of the whole world.”

“Thank you. That answer is exactly right, Jesus is the Savior of the whole world, but it did not tell us who Jesus is to you. Let’s ask this young woman with the three little children. Excuse me, ma’am. May I ask you a question for a public survey?”

Woman: “It better be a simple question. With these three to look after, I can hardly think!”

“My question is this. Who is Jesus to you?”

The Bible teaches certain fundamental truths. Once Jesus has been established as your Lord, these are the truths you need to know and to hide in your heart to live by them.

BASIC CHRISTIAN BELIEFS

The Scriptures

The Bible is the inspired Word of God, the revealed Will of God, the product of holy men of old who spoke and wrote as they were moved by the Holy Spirit. The New Covenant is recorded in the New Testament and is our infallible guide to conduct and doctrine. (1 Thess. 2:13; 11 Tim. 3:15-17; 11 Peter 1:21).

The Godhead

We have one true God who is manifested in three persons – the Father, who is the Creator, the Son, who is the Word come in the flesh, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds from the Father and the Son and lives in the hearts of believers. All three are co-equal and co-eternal. (John 1:14, 14:28, 15:26; Phil. 2:6)

Man, his Fall and his Redemption

Man is a created being, made in the image and likeness of God. Through Adam's fall, sin came into the world. Jesus Christ, the Son of God, was manifested to undo the work of the devil. Man's only hope of redemption is through the shed blood of Jesus Christ. He gave His life to redeem and restore man back to God. On the cross Jesus became sin and sickness providing both salvation and healing for all mankind. Salvation comes by believing in your heart that God raised Jesus from the dead and confessing with your mouth that Jesus is Lord. Salvation is the gift of God to man, separate from works and the law, and is operative by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, producing works acceptable to God. The inward evidence of salvation, to the believer, is the direct witness of the spirit. The outward evidence, to all men, is a life of true holiness and love. (Gen. 1:26-31; John 13:35; Rom. 3:10, 23, 8:16, 10:8-10; Eph 2:8; 1 John 3:8)

Eternal Life and the New Birth

Man's first step toward salvation is godly sorrow that causes one to repent. The New Birth is necessary to all men, and is the only way to eternal life with the Godhead. The New Birth is a spiritual re-creation of the spirit of man which, from that day, is submitted to and occupied by the Holy Spirit of God. (John 3:3-5, 14:16, 17; 11 Cor. 5:17, 7:10)

Water Baptism

Baptism in water by immersion is a direct commandment of our Lord and is for believers only. Baptism in water is a declaration to the world that a believer has died with Christ and has been raised with Him to walk in newness of life. (Matt. 28:19; Rom. 6:4; Col. 2:12)

Holy Spirit Baptism

The Baptism in the Holy Spirit and fire is a gift from God as promised by the Lord Jesus Christ to all believers who ask for it, and is received after the New Birth. This experience is accompanied by the initial evidence of speaking in other tongues as the Holy Spirit Himself gives utterance. With this gift comes the endowment of power for life and service, the bestowment of gifts and their uses in the work of the ministry. (Matt. 3:11; Acts 1:8, 2:4, 19:1-7)

Sanctification

Without holiness no man can see the Lord. Sanctification is a definite, yet progressive, work of grace, beginning at the time of the new birth and continuing until the consummation of salvation at Christ's return. The believer is perfected by the Holy Spirit day by day. (11 Cor. 3:18; Phil. 3:12-14; 1 Thess. 5:23; Heb. 12:14)

Salvation

Divine Healing

Healing is for the physical body and is brought by the power of God through the prayer of faith and the laying on of hands. The atonement of Jesus Christ gave this gift to believers. It is the privilege of every member of the Body of Christ to receive their healing. (Isa 53:4, 5; Matt 8:17; Mark 16:18; James 5:14-16; 1 Peter 2:24)

The Body of Christ

The Church as a whole, all the believers in Jesus Christ together, make up the Body of Christ. Each believer is an integral part. The Head of the Body is Jesus Christ. The Head operates through the Body and the Body operates by direction from the Head. (Eph. 1:22, 2:19-22, 5:30)

Divine Prosperity

A believer in Jesus Christ, a member of His Body, has been given all things that pertain to life and godliness. Every believer has a direct, personal relationship with God. Jesus brought peace that passes all understanding to His Body of believers. Being children of God ensures that all things needed for this life are available. Financial prosperity is assured as Christ became poor so that His followers could become rich. Social success is found in the loving fellowship of brothers and sisters in Christ. A good definition for prosperity is having everything one needs and having more than that to share with others. (Rom. 14:18; 11 Cor. 5:17-21, 9:6-11; 11 Tim. 1:7; 11 Peter 1:3)

The Return of the Lord

Jesus is coming again soon to gather all His saints, His Body, to heaven. There will be a great tribulation on the earth, during which many will receive Jesus as their Lord. On the great Day of the Lord, Jesus will return in triumph to rule as King of kings and Lord of lords. Together with His saints, who shall be kings and priests, Jesus will reign on earth for one thousand years. After the 1000 years there will be a new heaven and earth. (Acts 1:11; 1 Cor. 15:51, 52; 1 Thess. 16:17; 11 Thess. 2:1; Rev. 7:9-14, 20:6, 21)

Eternal Damnation

The one who has not accepted Jesus as Lord will die in his or her sins and will be hopelessly and eternally lost in the Lake of Fire. After death there is no further opportunity of hearing the Gospel, repenting of sins, or accepting Jesus. The Lake of Fire is literal and eternal. Hell is reserved for those who will live for eternity separated from the Godhead. (Heb. 9:27; Rev. 19:20, 20:10-15)
